I am so incredibly grateful for this Emmaus community. I cannot wait to see what God has in store for this upcoming walk. We are going to have


fun, we are going to be serious, and we are going to show Gods Love and Grace in ways some will never even know; regardless if it is in the conference



Live among believers: don't walk on a 'broken' spirit

A cowboy was driving down a dirt road late at night in his pickup truck with his horse riding in the trailer behind. He failed to negotiate a curve and his truck tipped over and landed in a ditch knocking the cowboy unconscious.

Several minutes later, he awoke to the flashing lights of a highway patrol officer. The officer walked up to the

horse, saw his leg was broken, and did what only he could do. He pulled out his service revolver and put the horse out of his misery.

The cowboy heard

everything and felt terrible about his horse. But more painful was what he felt from his own leg, which was surely broken. The officer walked up to the cowboy and asked, "Are you okay?" The cowboy took a look at the smoking revolver in the trooper's hand and quickly replied, "Never felt better!"

That story is a picture of a stark reality for many Christians. They walk around broken and yet when asked by a fellow believer how they're doing, they put on their best Sunday School smile and say, "Never felt better!"

The Christian life is meant to be lived among believers who are open and honest about what's really going on. Don't ever feel like you have to put on a happy face. The giant sequoia tree is an amazing example of strength that comes from surrounding support. These giants of the forest can grow to around 300 feet tall with a diameter that exceeds 20 feet.

The incredible thing about these trees is that they can grow in just three feet of soil and withstand high winds. Their

"The Christian life is meant to be lived among believers who are open and honest about what's really going on." high winds. Their strength lies in the fact that their roots intertwine with other sequoias, providing mutual strength and shared resources.

God's plan for us is

like that. Our ability to stand tall in spite of the storming winds of life is related to the love and support we receive from God and one another.

Did you know there are 59 "one anothers" in the New Testament? Love one another, encourage one another, pray for one another, serve

one another, honor one another, and so on. There is great power in the entwining gifts of words of encouragement, prayers of intercession, worshiping together, and sometimes just sitting with one another sharing the presence of our support and love with one another. Find someone you can trust, share what's really going on, and you'll build an authentic community of faith around you. Isn't that what our "Walk



To Emmaus" is all about? Let's all step up and "one another" each other by sponsoring someone or volunteering

are one of the greatest examples many of us have of agape service.

I share the following words with you from the letter to the Hebrews chapter 10 verses 24 and 25. And let us consider how to stir up one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near.

These words are a stirring reminder of how we can help propel one another to greater and more fervent works in the example of Jesus. They also bring to light that we are to meet, one with another. Last, but certainly not least, is the "but encouraging one another".

Let me ask this question of each of us; if we are to stir and encourage one another at these weekends but we have not reached out to remind, talk to, or encourage a fresh, first-time 4th dayer to come join us in the service of pilgrims, how likely is it to happen?

This question is even more desperate if the 4th dayer lives in a community with little or no contact within an Emmaus reunion group. So......they had the mountain top experience, and they, just like we warned, go back to the grind of the world, maybe soon discouraged. Hopefully they are serving their church and local members of the body of Christ with increased stamina. I have seen two things to be true concerning getting connected to the Emmaus community. First, people that come back two or three times become connected to both those that served them and also those they served, forming lifelong bounds. Without this bond of accountability and love, each and every one of us is more susceptible to falling away.

Ecclesiastes 4:9-10 Two are better than one, because they have a good reward for their toil. For if they fall, one will lift up his fellow; but woe to him who is alone when he falls and has not another to lift him up.

The second observation is that brothers and sisters who come back to participate (SERVE) in Emmaus weekends are oft, very spiritually enriched. This enrichment leads to other good fruits of the spirit, namely that sharing of Emmaus (sponsorship) and growth in answering God's call to service in our lives.

Make no mistake, the filling of the pipeline for all the Emmaus ministries (The Walk, Face to Face, and Chrysalis) all starts with pilgrims coming through the door, and then coming through again and again as 4th dayers.

I leave you with one last question. Is there anyone from your years of the walk, that you haven't seen or heard in months or years. Ministry manager has a lot of numbers if needed.
