God verbally breathed or spoke his words into the writers much like He

breathed life into man in Genesis. 2 Peter 1:21 says "For no prophecy was ever produced by the will of man, but men spoke from God as they were carried along by the Holy Spirit".

Scripture was given by God as his way of conveying His will to mankind.

I recently read an article about a missionary telling this story of the power of prayer to his home church. As I was reflecting on it my thoughts turned to the similarities of an Emmaus Walk.

While serving at a small field hospital in Africa, every two weeks this missionary

traveled by bicycle through the jungle to a nearby city to get money and purchase medicine and supplies. This was a journey of two days and required camping overnight at the halfway point.

to pray that day stood up.

Upon arrival in the city, he observed two men fighting, one of whom had been seriously injured. He treated him for his injuries and at the same time talked to him about the Lord. He then traveled two days home without incident.

Two weeks later he repeated his journey. Upon arriving in the city, he was approached by the young man he had treated who told him that he had known he carried money and medicines. He said, "Some friends and I followed you into the jungle, knowing you would camp overnight. We planned to kill you and take your money and drugs. But just as we were about to move into your camp, we saw that you were surrounded by 26 armed guards."

At this, the missionary laughed and said that he was certainly all alone. The young man pressed the point and said, "No sir, I was not the only person to see the guards. My

five friends also saw them, and we all counted them. It was because of those guards that we were afraid and left you alone."

At this point in the story, one of the men in the congregation he was speaking to jumped to his feet and interrupted the missionary, "On the night of your incident in Africa, it was morning here and I was preparing to go play golf. I

was about to putt when I felt the urge to pray for you. In fact, the urging of the Lord was so strong, I called men in this church to meet with me here in the sanctuary to pray for you. Would all of those men who met with me on that day stand up?"

The men who had met together to pray that day stood up. There were 26.

A 'Walk' is bathed in prayer. We pray for the team and pilgrims even before it's completely put together. Throughout the weekend we pray for a hedge of protection around the conference room and church. Everything is done in prayer; prayers for the pilgrim's crosses, speakers, table family chapel, and one on one individual prayers.

We've all felt the presence of the Holy Spirit during a 'Walk'. Sometimes we see immediate, miraculous results. Sometimes we may not know what the power of our prayers had for months or years later. Sometimes we may never know, but, the Bible tells us that God always hears our prayers.

The Apostle James wrote, "the prayer of a righteous person is powerful & effective." Keep praying!
